Key segments:

1. "Silence" of God and prayer

2. Bible pray-ers and prayer time

Through the Bible God reveals His promises. Claim His promises through

Through the Bible we discern God's expectation and ask for guidance through prayer.

The Bible gives principles, we pray for wisdom to apply to particular circumstances.

3. Bible reveals God's character and gives confidence in prayer.

Nehemiah 1:5.6

Acts 4:24-31

4. Reading the Bible leads us into confession and worship in prayer.

Nehemiah 9:3

Action steps:

Ask for God's guidance before reading His word

Read Biblical topics or narratives that parallel what you are praying about.

Observe how Bible characters approached it and how God stepped in.

Sing scripture songs in your prayers and pray for God's guidance based on what you have read.
